WHY RESPONSIBLE FATHERHOOD?

Despite the ever-increasing body of research that confirms that fatherhood engagement is a key social determinant of health for families and a critical public health concern, many people remain unaware of these issues. This lack of understanding allows the status quo to operate on a narrative that often diminishes or excludes the father's role from family life.

CCFF seeks to remedy this by offering professional development and training sessions for service providers, organizations, and the Kentucky community-at-large.

WHAT IS OFFERED?

Based on both evidence-based research and lived experience narratives, these trainings provide an opportunity for attendees to gain a robust understanding of the importance of responsible fatherhood. Presentations range in length and can be adapted for the purpose of a workshop, class, conference, webinar, and other settings.



PRESENTATION TOPICS

Presentations can be tailored to particular groups, whether serving in education, human services, early childhood development, or any other service-oriented field. Examples of topics include:

- Responsible Fatherhood as a Protective Factor for Children and Families
- Strategic Methods for Engaging Fathers

- Maternal Health and Wellbeing
